The Santa Clarita Cowboy Festival was established in 1994 to promote and celebrate the history, music, poetry, film, and fine arts & crafts of the ranching and cowboy culture of the North American West. The 2010 Festival will be held in April.



Established to support and compliment the Cowboy Festival, the highly interactive Cowboy Roping Workshops are presented to Santa Clarita Valley elementary, junior high, and high schools, one classroom at a time. The roping workshops highlight the history of ranching and cowboy culture in the North American West, and educate K-12 students about the necessity of roping skills on a ranch as both an artform and a livelihood. In its partnership with the schools, the City of Santa Clarita covers half of all fees for the program.

Workshops are 45 minutes long, with a 20-minute break between workshops if more than one is presented. Specific dates and times are based on school schedules and performer availability.
